## BUDDING SCIENTISTS AT ROSELANDS AND STAFFORD



It's been an exciting Science Week this week! We started the week with a visit from storyteller, Craig Jenkins, who told us about animals who saw their reflection in a river and heard their voices echoing. We have had other visitors including two Sport Scientists from the University of Brighton who investigated how fast they could cycle in the hall, a Biomedical Scientist teaching us about blood and Little Kickers came in to teach us about how exercise keeps us healthy. At Stafford, each class enjoyed a science demonstration including

exploring Magdeburg Hemispheres.

Year 6 were learning about the inequality of clean water around the world. The children worked in group to create their own water filters to clean muddy water with varying degrees of success.
